

Did you know we boast *many* literary connections?


With seven libraries and more than 44,000 books in Longleat House, it is a treasure trove of the written word and ancestors of the 8th and current Marquess of Bath are even said to have inspired Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet.

Another ancestor of the present Marquess, William Thynne, was the first real editor of the works of that 'Father of English Literature', Geoffrey Chaucer. William Thynne was the uncle of Sir John Thynne, the builder of Longleat, and produced an edition of Chaucer's works in 1532. An extraordinary volume of some of the

original manuscripts he used for this is preserved at Longleat.

And that's not all, legendary author Jane Austen could have been one of the many day-trippers who visited us as practices in place at the estate when she was alive do feature in her novels.

Day visitors were invited to sign their name in a book and an early entry has recently been identified as that of Jane Austen's nephew, the Rev. J.E. Austen, who later wrote the first major biography of her life, A Memoir of Jane Austen, 1870.



The Longleat archives show the fashionable Regency pursuit of visiting a grand country house and grounds described in Pride and Prejudice was flourishing and Prejudice was flourishing on the at Longleat where the 2nd Marquess was one of the first to open his front door to well-to-do visitors.

Her works were clearly popular at Longleat. A newly discovered invoice shows the 2nd Marquess purchased Mansfield Park as soon as it came out, in May 1814, from Hatchard's bookshop in London (reputedly a haunt of Austen herself) for 18 shillings – it cost six shillings per volume and came out in three.

O Romeo, Romeo, wherefore art thou Romeo? – Longleat should probably be the answer to that famous line.

It seems the Bard was inspired by a real-life love affair in the 16th century.

The star-crossed lovers were Thomas Thynne, 16-year-old

grandson of Sir John who built Longleat and Maria Tuchet, whose mother came from a rival family, the Marvins, who fell in love and married on the night they met in 1594.

In 1979 historian and lecturer Alison Wall first suggested that these English circumstances may have shaped Shakespeare's plot.

There is compelling evidence that Shakespeare was inspired by the Thynne-

Marvin feud, in writing his new version of this old tale, and it would have been very fresh inspiration: it is thought the play was composed in 1595–6 and published (unofficially) in 1597.

We are also home to one of the very few copies of Shakespeare's First Folios remaining in private possession.




