

## All Saints', Alton Priors

1

A medieval church with Norman features, this simple, peaceful and beautiful church dates back to the 12th century. All Saints' enjoys terrific views of the Alton Barnes White Horse and stands on an extensive network of public footpaths, close to the Ridgeway. A 1,700 year old yew tree stands in the churchyard and the nave features hidden Sarsen stones - prehistoric Wiltshire stones that were used in the creation of Stonehenge and Avebury and held religious significance to Neolithic Britons.

## The Red Lion Freehouse

The Red Lion is a country village pub holding a Michelin Star with a 5 star Guest House. Located on the edge of Salisbury Plain and just 15 minutes from Stonehenge, the laidback pub and sophisticated bedrooms provide an ideal base from which to explore the stunning Wiltshire countryside.

Now mostly an atmospheric partial ruin, St Leonard's tiny remaining chancel is packed with monuments to local people. The church sits in a gorgeous location on the edge of the picture-postcard Wiltshire village of Sutton Veny, surrounded by a park-like churchyard, open fields and foot and cycle paths.


## The Beckford Arms

## St Mary's, Old Dilton

The 14th-century St Mary's lies down a pretty wooded lane near the river Biss, on one of the many walking paths to the Westbury White Horse.

This very special little church is approached through a railway arch that opens out onto a simple churchyard, revealing an unusual building with a tiny stone spire, like an inverted ice-cream cone. Inside little has changed since the 18th century, with bleached box pews, a three-decker pulpit, family pews and railed galleries intact.

The Three Daggers is all about great tasting food, using locally sourced produce at its very best. As well as the pub, you can also visit their Farm Shop (stocked with produce from their very own farm) and the Three Daggers Brewery. Situated in the village of Edington, The Three Daggers encompasses the best that Wiltshire has to offer.

## St John the Baptist Church, Inglesham

This exquisitely beautiful 13th century church stands a stone's throw from the Thames and Ridgeway Paths. Pioneering Victorian designer William Morris – who lived at nearby Kelmscott – saved the church in the 19th century, overseeing its restoration and ensuring it kept its medieval identity.

An amazing series of paintings from the 13th to the 19th century cover the walls. You can see 15th century angels above the chancel arch, an early 14th century doom painting on the east wall of the north aisle, several 19th century texts, and a 13th century masonry pattern throughout the chancel.
